

## <u>RESOLUTION</u>

WHEREAS, fighting crimes against senior citizens is a priority for state government, and Florida seeks to provide as many resources to protect our senior citizens from becoming victims of crime; and

**WHEREAS,** the Seniors vs. Crime Program began in 1989 as a source of assistance to seniors being targeted by criminals; and

WHEREAS, the Seniors vs. Crime Program is a voluntary program consisting of retired citizens, known as Senior Sleuths, who educate other seniors on consumer fraud and protection as well as assist law enforcement during consumer investigations; and

WHEREAS, in 2001, the state's first walk-in facility for seniors was opened, known as a Storefront, which allowed the Senior Sleuth volunteers to better communicate with incoming seniors seeking advice or sharing complaints of potential criminal conduct; and

**WHEREAS,** today, 24 Seniors vs. Crime Storefronts now operate throughout the State of Florida with over 2,500 Senior Sleuths dedicated to educating seniors and actively participating in crime prevention; and

WHEREAS, together, these 2,500 Senior Sleuth volunteers have helped recover more than \$4 million for seniors victimized by con artists.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the Governor and Cabinet of the State of Florida do hereby recognize November 2005 as

## SENIORS VERSUS CRIME MONTH

and remind citizens of the importance of fighting crime against senior citizens.
