with us.

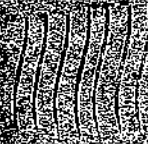
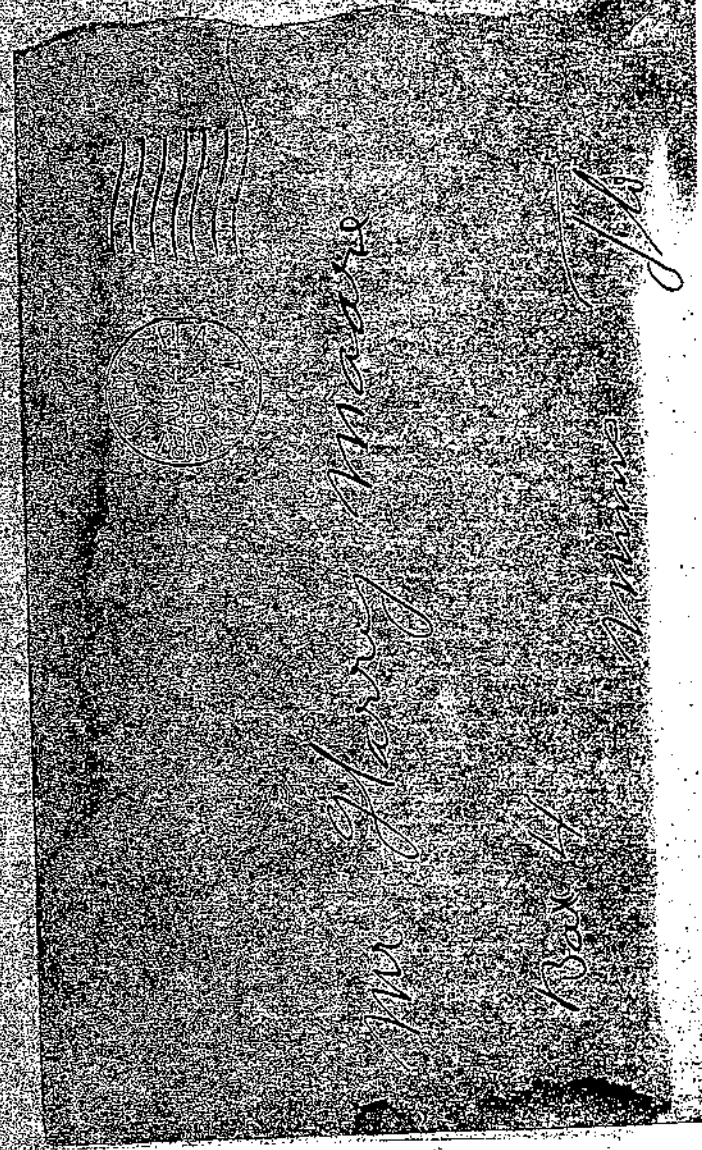

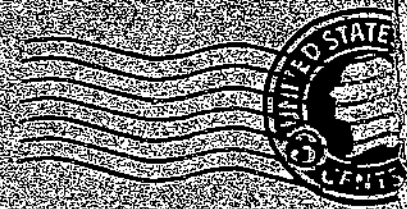
