On Saturday, March 29, 1947, in Charleston, S. C., shortly after the afternoon session, the Florida Delegation met in an anteroom of the Avery Institute with the president, Mr. Harry T. Moore presiding.

At this meeting, all delegates were introduced to each other, which totaled a delegation of forty-nine (49) members.

The president then told of the formation of new branches during the year in the state. Among those formed were branches at Apopka and Plant City, Florida.

Various members discussed their plans for increasing the membership and activities of their organizations upon return home. Mention was also made of the importance of building the Youth Council along with the Adult Body. The requirement of twenty-five paid members to form a chartered Youth Council and fifty paid members to form a branch was given as information to those who were contemplating forming these two groups.

The president cited progress made in several of the branches and further called attention to the State meeting of the Youth Council to be held in Mims during August and the State Conference, N.A.A.C.P. to be held in Lake Wales during November.

There being no further questions or business, the meeting was adjourned with prayer by Rev. W. A. Johnson of St. Petersburg.
