Dear Mrs. Kinsler:

I owe you an apology for my long delay in answering your letter. However, we have not forgotten the Garfield Green Case, nor have we given up hope of securing definite action in this matter.

No doubt Rev. W. J. H. Black already has told you that we asked him to go to Winter Haven and talk over this matter with Atty. Allen E. Walker. Atty. Walker feels that he can get the warrant served on the man who assaulted Green, and that he can assist with the prosecution.

It is my opinion that this procedure will get quicker and more direct results than the course suggested by Atty. Carter in Jacksonville. Even if we fail to get a conviction, the people, both white and colored, will know that the organization made a serious effort to secure justice in this case.

Atty. Walker estimates that cost will be about \$50.00. We are suggesting that the local Branch finance the case. However, we shall be glad to let the matter come up in the name of the State Conference, in order to ease the pressure on officers of the local Branch. In other words, you can pay Atty. Walker the money, but we can make it appear that the Conference is bringing this action. This will protect the local people from any prejudiced feelings.

As soon as your officers are ready, you may see Atty. Walker and show him this letter. You can then find out from him how much cash you will need to start action on the case. From time to time please let me know how the case is developing.

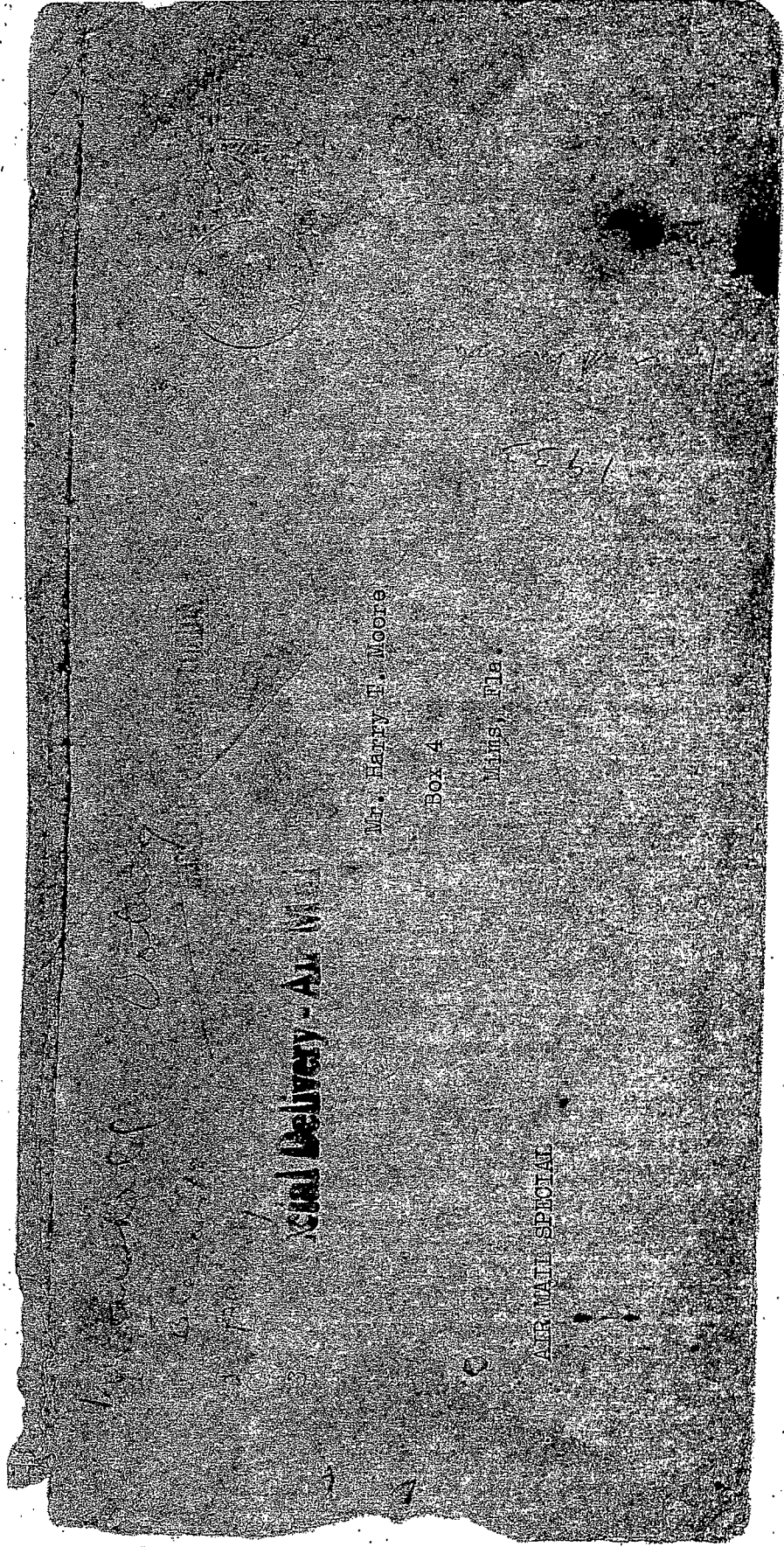
