The first meeting of the local organization was held at the West Side District Office of the Afro-American Gas and Heating Company, March 15, 1948.

Immediately after this meeting, invitations were extended to Negro Leaders asking them to send representatives to our next meeting. The purpose of the Junior Branch was discussed and the Officers were elected.

An April Campaign was conducted to register Negro Citizens. In June a threefold plan was adopted, namely: Membership Drive - Survey all Negro Public Schools and to conduct a State Wide Meeting. The Officers and Committees of the local organization worked diligently in order to make this effort a success. For which Comm. on detail.
