Description: School design is increasingly influenced by safety concerns. There is a direct relationship of the design and use of the environment to human behavior and crime. Experienced Crime Prevention Through Environmental Design (CPTED) presenters will examine school safety through the perspectives of law enforcement, school administrators, architects, planners and engineers by reviewing school designs including parking, student drop-off, bus pick-up, signage, hallways, lockers, restrooms, lighting and more. The threat of terrorism in schools is another important aspect of CPTED that will be explored. Activities will include reading site plans, table-top exercises, class discussions, and school site reviews. Teams of school resource officers, school administrators, architects, planners and engineers are encouraged to attend and bring existing plans or problems to be reviewed. This course will examine and suggest realistic solutions to problematic campus designs. Participants will leave with the confidence and skills to conduct school site safety surveys.

The Attorney General's Office has applied for Continuing Education Units (CEUs) for Architects, through the Department of Business and Professional Regulation (DBPR). Approval is expected but not guaranteed.
