Assistance may be available for:

Qualification Requirements:

(Additional qualification criteria, deadlines and exceptions not listed may apply.)

- **Crime must be reported to law enforcement within 72 hours.**
- **Application must be filed within one year after the crime date or within two years if good cause is shown for the filing delay.**
- **Victim must fully cooperate with law enforcement, the State Attorney's Office, and the Office of the Attorney General.**
- **Victim must not have engaged in an unlawful activity.**
- **Victim's conduct must not have contributed to his or her own injuries.**
- **Victim or claimant must not have been confined or in custody in a county or municipal facility; a state or federal correctional facility; or a juvenile detention, commitment, or assessment facility; adjudicated as a habitual felony offender, habitual violent offender, or violent career criminal; or adjudicated guilty of a forcible felony offense.**
- **Relocation claims for victims of domestic violence, sexual battery, or human trafficking must be filed through and certified by the applicable domestic violence or rape crisis center (depending on benefit selection).**
